**Foreign Language Competency**

Meredith College requires competency at the “intermediate-mid level” determined by a competency test in the chosen language or other means. See <http://www.meredith.edu/academics/gened> for a complete listing of ways to show competency. The default requirement without showing competency is 12 credit hours, nine of which must be in one language. *Students transferring in 60 or more credit hours may fulfill the foreign language requirement through two courses in the same language either transferred in or taken at Meredith College.*

### **Literature Elective**

Any ENG literature course at the 200 level from the *NC-CC Comprehensive Articulation Agreement Transfer Course List*.

### **Cultural Perspectives Elective**

Any HIS, REL, HUM, PHI from the *NC-CC Comprehensive Articulation Agreement Transfer Course List* not used to fulfill other requirements **OR** one course chosen from the following:

### **Laboratory Science**

Any 4 credit laboratory science course chosen from BIO, CHM, GEL, or PHY from the *NC-CC Comprehensive Articulation Agreement Transfer Course List*. NOT including: BIO 110, CHM 131, GEL 111, or PHY 110.

### **Science in Society Elective**

Choose one course from the following:

BIO 140 and lab <i>Environmental Biology</i>	BIO 173 <i>Microbes in World Affairs</i>

### **Behavioral and Social Sciences**

Any two courses chosen from ANT, ECO, GEO, POL, PSY, or SOC in the *NC-CC Comprehensive Articulation Agreement Transfer Course List* EXCEPT ECO 151, GEO 110, GEO 131, GEO 132 and POL 110.

### **Arts and Aesthetics**

Any ART, DRA, or MUS **not used as cultural perspective elective** or one course chosen from the following: DAN 110 *Dance Appreciation*, DAN 211 *Dance History I*, or DAN 212 *Dance History II*.

### **Health and Physical Learning**

Four dance/physical education activity credits **OR** any 2 or 3 credit health course plus 3 dance/physical education activity credits.

**Writing Intensive Thread** – Equivalency credit determined by transcript evaluation.

**Ethics Intensive Thread** – Equivalency credit determined by transcript evaluation **OR** PHI 240 *Introduction to Ethics*.

**Oral Communication Thread** – Equivalency credit determined by transcript evaluation **OR** one of the following: COM 231 *Public Speaking*, COM 233 *Persuasive Speaking*, COM 251 *Debate I*, or COM 252 *Debate II*.

**Information Literacy Thread** – No Equivalent.

**Convocation/Cultural Events** – No Equivalent.

**Experiential Learning Requirement** – *Internship, Research, Service Learning, Student Teaching, or Approved Alternative* – See Meredith General Education website at <http://www.meredith.edu/academics/gened> for a list of approved activities. Experiences other than course work may fulfill this requirement.

**Competency in Fundamental Computer Skills** – CIS 110 *Introduction to Computers*, or competency may be evidenced through course work and instructor verification. Contact the Office of the Computer Applications Specialist or the Office of General Education for details.
